




Stewardship Behaviour

Resemblance: D1 Euclidean distance




Nature for Humans Uber-Steward

TPB / Cognitive Hierarchy






Nature for Nature Uber-Steward

<u>Motivating factors</u>: Ecosystem integrity, wildlife, protection (reserve), uniqueness / rarity, recreation, amenity, loss avoidance







- 1. Highlight "What lives here"

- 3. Facilitate direct experiences with nature
- 4. Enable extended social networks
- 5. Connect values, actions and outcomes
- 6. Segment messaging to target anthropo- and eco- audiences
